Application and Information for HRSA – Scholarship for Disadvantaged Students (SDS)

Scholarship funding has been provided to the Bastyr University Department of Midwifery through a grant from Health Resources & Services Administration (HRSA) for several full-time students who meet the federal criteria as being from a disadvantaged background and who demonstrate exceptional financial need. The Department of Midwifery will select all qualified students and administer objectives for recipients which include group activities, peer mentoring and faculty advising.

As specified by the funding agency, scholarships can be granted only to students who meet HRSA's criteria for "educationally disadvantaged" or "economically disadvantaged." <u>The definitions for each of these are listed in the DoMW Commons on Canvas</u>. If you are uncertain about whether you meet one of these definitions, please check the definitions for more information. Students are encouraged to apply, even if they are not sure if they are eligible. The Department of Midwifery will determine eligibility based on the information submitted with this application, according to the criteria set forth by HRSA.

As specified by the funding agency, the award will pay at least one-half of the established annual cost of tuition for the Midwifery program, up to a maximum of \$40,000 per student for reasonable educational and living expenses. Federal guidelines are used to formulate these budgets.

Scholarships are granted on a one-year basis, with the possibility of continued support if a) the Department of Midwifery receives continued federal funding for this program, and b) the student fulfills requirements for continuation, including participating in program activities designed to enhance retention. Applications will be submitted and reviewed annually. Awards are for a single year, and receiving an award in one year does not guarantee future eligibility. The amount of an award may also change in a future year and is dependent on factors such as changes in your financial aid status and the number of eligible students.

For enrolled students who are seeking scholarships for the 2020-2021 academic year, **the priority deadline is 11:59pm on Sunday, December 13**. Applications will continue to be accepted on a rolling basis until all of the scholarship funds have been disbursed for this academic year.
